Cats Aren't Trophies recently held a joint press conference with The Wild Animal Sanctuary in Keenesburg, and I want to give you a summary of our comprehensive case for voters to favor our measure to halt the cruel killing of mountain lions and bobcats for their heads and beautiful coats.

The day began with a behind-the-scenes tour for media by Pat Craig, hometown hero and founder of the Wildlife Animal Sanctuary, a haven for mountain lions, bobcats, and other mistreated wild animals.


